

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

How was school today? What did you do today? Ever ask your child this question and get 'Good' and 'Nothing'

Talking to your child is important and studies have shown that oral language skills precede reading and writing and help to develop rich vocabulary and language/communication skills - which all contribute to reading and writing success. So always seek opportunities to talk to your child.

A great conversation to have with your child is about their day at school. The key to finding out about your child's day at school is to ask the right question. Each fortnight I will be adding 2 questions that you can ask your child. Here are the first two. Listen to your child and give them the opportunity to talk without interruption. If you get a short answer and would like more information just ask - "I'd love to hear more about that..." or "Tell more about that"

- 1. What did you find exciting about your learning today?
- 2. When did you feel cared for today?

ATTENDANCE

Australia has one of the very best education systems anywhere in the world. Each day, our young people are provided with opportunities to learn more about the world they live in through their experiences in and out of the classroom. Schools teach children about themselves, their relationships with others and about life beyond school. This includes preparing them for the workforce.

Regular attendance at school is critical to ensuring that every student has the kind of opportunities in life that he or she deserves. When students are not at school, they are missing out on so much. Without the knowledge, the skills or the support that schools are so good at providing, young people can get left behind and find themselves underprepared for a fast-paced and often very challenging world.

In 2017, St Josephs will be lending our support to a campaign called 'Every Learner, Every Day', an initiative designed to all remind students and parents why regular school attendance is so important. As part of this campaign, a range of resources and strategies will be made available to help parents, if help is needed. A poster that explains simply the benefits of being at school regularly is included in this communication. I encourage you to think about the ideas suggested on the poster and to speak to your child about these messages.

I appreciate that this is not a matter that may impact on a large number of our families; however, if the 'Every learner, every day' campaign can assist even just a few students to be at school more regularly, with all the benefits that come with that, it is a terrific outcome.

Thank you in advance for your support of this important initiative.



CodeSpace Education is Back! Bringing an all-new Coding Club to your school.

After the huge success of our last coding workshop in term 4 last year we are introducing a new and improved coding club which will introduce coding to beginners and develop the skills of students who have coded before. Our Coding Club is for students in Year 2 and up but younger students can still join, provided they have previous coding experience.

Coding is a wonderfully beneficial skill to have in our current digital revolution. These important skills will allow students to think critically and solve problems by troubleshooting their own work and devising a solution.

This term at St Joseph's, you can try your hand at coding using Scratch. Hone your creativity and designer skills with Minecraft Modding and unleash your inner intellect by learning how to program robots.

CodeSpace Education's six week beginners course will consist of these three modules; Scratch, Minecraft Modding and Robot programming. Students will spend two weeks on each module in order to get a taste of each coding format.

This workshop will occur every Tuesday afternoon from 2:45pm - 4:15pm (1.5 hours) and will encourage student to learn in a self-driven matter to achieve their goals and enjoy themselves along the way.

This workshop is \$99 for a 6-week program and the workshop starts 14th February 2017 and ends 21st March 2017.

SCHOOL FEES TERM 1 2017

Families will be receiving their School Fees statement in the upcoming weeks. These statements are sent from the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) outlining the 2017 school fees for your child. Included in this Tax Invoice are the Payment Plans families can adopt for their 2017 tuition fees. Please follow the instructions, should you wish to utilise the Direct Debit or BPay options to commence payments on the 6th March as follows:

FLEXIBLE PAYMENT PLAN - NORMAL RUN

We are pleased to be able to offer you a Flexible Payment Plan (FPP) for your 2017 School Fees. Our preferred payment method for FPP is Direct Debit, however the form will need to be completed and lodged with the Diocesan Development Fund before the 24th February 2017. Alternatively you may elect to use BPAY but would need to set this up directly in BPAY via your Bank so that the first payment occurs by 6th March 2017.

Dear friends,

Re: Royal Commission Case Study 50 - Catholic Church Authorities

The final hearing involving the Catholic Church at the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse commences on 6 February 2017.

For the victims and survivors, for the Catholic community and for many in the wider Australian community, this hearing may be a difficult and even distressing time, as the Royal Commission reviews the evidence it has already received and seeks to understand why and how these tragedies occurred.

Deeply mindful of the hurt and pain caused by abuse, I once again offer my sincerest apology on behalf of the Catholic Church and the Diocese of Parramatta. I am deeply sorry for the damage that has been done to the lives of victims of sexual abuse and their loved ones. As Pope Francis said recently, 'it is a sin that shames us'.

Over the next three weeks, evidence presented during the Royal Commission hearings will be analysed, statistics about the extent of abuse will be made public, and the way forward will be explored. Many of our bishops - including myself - and other Catholic leaders will appear before the Royal Commission. They will explain what the Church has been doing to change the old culture that allowed abuse to continue and to put in place new policies, structures and protections to safeguard children and vulnerable adults.

Pope Francis has urged the whole Church to, 'find the courage needed to take all necessary measures and to protect in every way the lives of our children, so that such crimes may never be repeated'.

Our Diocese will continue working openly and transparently with the Royal Commission and other authorities in order to ensure our child protection policies and procedures are strengthened.
