#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Jn 12:24-26

Jesus said to his disciples: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me."

Amen, amen... unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies.

The coming of Jesus into the world overturns all its cherished values. If the "Amen, amen" saying were merely an agricultural truism or only a parable, the statement that follows it transmutes it into a law of life for the Christian. It is, of course, not exclusive to John. Jesus' saying, "Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life" (v25), is recorded by both Matthew (cf 10:39; 16:25) and Luke (cf 17:33). True, the saying itself does not proclaim a truth, which is difficult for the believer to accept. Yet, in a Gospel that insists so much on proof could anyone have that the believers in him possess eternal life than the prodigality with which they expend their own lives in the loving service of others? It is in squandering their lives for others- "whoever hates his life in this world" (v25)- that they provide irrefutable proof of their possession of eternal life he has brought them.

The saying, moreover, is a fitting preface to the Revealer's "He loved his own... he loved them to the end" (13:1). The death he will die for his own is both the revelation and the proof of this love, and therefore can be spoken of as Jesus' glorification.

"Whoever serves me must follow me" (In 12:26).

The student's Joey's pockets in the classroom are filling up every day with children receiving Joey's for their excellent learning, acts of kindness, respect and being safe. I have been signing so many Bronze Awards over the past weeks. Congratulations to all students for their remarkable efforts.

The St Joseph's teachers and staff are always supporting your child throughout their daily school routines. At St Joseph's our teachers are excellent educators and role models.

A role model is a person who inspires and encourages us to strive for greatness, live to our fullest potential and see the best in ourselves. A role model is someone we admire and someone we aspire to be like. We learn through them, through their commitment to excellence and through their ability to make us realise our own personal growth. We look to them for advice and guidance.

A role model can be anybody: a parent, a sibling, a friend but some of our most influential and life-changing role models are <u>teachers</u>.

Teachers follow students through each pivotal stage of development. At six to eight hours a day, five days a week, teachers are poised to become one of the most influential people in your child's life. After their parents, children will first learn from their teacher. Teachers guide students through yet another important transition: adolescence. As children become young adults, learning throughout middle school and into High School. St Joseph's staff answers their questions, listen to their problems and teach them about this new phase of their lives. They not only watch your child grow but help them grow.

Much of what students learn from their greatest teachers is not detailed on a syllabus. Teachers who help us grow as people are responsible for imparting some of life's most important lessons. During their initial school years, students encounter, perhaps for the first time, other children of the same age and begin to form some of their first friendships. As a teacher, they will show our students how to become independent and form their own relationships, teachers will carefully guide them and intervene when necessary. School is as much a place of social learning as academic learning, and this is true, not only in our early years of education, but all the way through to High School. Though a teacher's influence on the social sphere of school lessens as students mature, those early lessons still have an effect on how they will interact with others in the future.

Teachers are founts of experience. They have already been where their students are going, undergone what they will go through and are in a position to pass along lessons, not only regarding subject matter, but lessons on life.

At St Joseph's our staff are so committed to making a difference in the lives of your children. Not only are they providing a quality Catholic education for our students, they are also supporting many extracurricular activities to further engage our students in the school day and beyond, for example



#### PBS4L

It is great as I walk around the school to hear about students getting their 'Joeys' as a way to reinforce the fact that they are upholding our three rules of being Safe, Respectful and Learners. Joeys are given in the classroom, on the playground and even at assembly as the "Joey Spotters" look out for Safe, Learner and Respectful students.

Teachers continually monitor student behaviour, focusing on reinforcing good behaviours. Unfortunately at times some students need little reminders, therefore teachers work through a whole school consequences system of three warnings to help students monitor and regulate their behaviour. When students reach the third warning during a session, they are required to complete a reflection sheet that gets sent home and is followed by a phone call to the parents by the teacher or a member of the leadership team, if it is a major behaviour incident.

Teachers also complete an incident report onto our database regarding the incident. The PBS4L and Leadership team continually monitor this database, as they look for patterns of behaviour especially where and when these behaviours occur. This information is vital as it provides us with valuable data about our students and areas of risk around our school. As a result of this. the staff have spent some time working on modifying our playground rules and establishing appropriate playing behaviours for each area. As well as this, lessons on being safe on the playground have been developed in order to teach students about safe play on the playground.

#### **WRITING**

Each fortnight, I have been sitting with the teachers from each grade to reflect on student writing samples and lessons that have been implemented in the classroom as a way to improve student writing in our school. This is a great forum for teachers to reflect on student data and best practice as it generates a rich conversation deepening teachers' understanding of their students and best practice to improve student writing.

If you would like to see some excellent examples of student writing in our school, there will be student writing samples for each grade outside the library in frames for everyone to read and marvel at the quality writing happening in our

school.

# The Feast of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop 8th August



Mary MacKillop was born in 1842 in Fitzroy, Melbourne. On 8 August 1909 she died, having suffered a disabling stroke in 1902. Inspired by a meeting with Fr. Julian Tenison-Woods, Mary MacKillop at the age of 25 took her vows and the religious name, "Mary of the Cross". In doing so, she founded the congregation of the Sisters of St Joseph. Soon after taking her religious vows, Mary MacKillop began schools. Within 5 years of taking her vows and founding the Con-

gregation of the Sisters of Saint Joseph, Mary had established over 30 schools, in South Australia and over 100 women had joined the Sisters of Saint Joseph.

Mary MacKillop was very conscious of the plight of the poor and needy. She worked with families that lived in isolated areas of Australia. As a result, Mary MacKillop pioneered a new form of religious life in Australia and commenced a "system" of "Josephite" schools that would provide education, especially for the children of the poor. In 1873, Pope Pius IX gave Papal approval for the Congregation of the Sisters of Saint Joseph.

Even today, many Australians can say that they too have felt the impact of the enormous work started by St. Mary of the Cross MacKillop, having been educated or cared for, by the Sisters of Saint Joseph. She was noted for her trust in the providence of God and miracles of healing have been attributed to her. She was declared a Saint by Pope Benedict XVI on the 17th October 2010.


The Roman Missal has the following prayer for the Feast of St. Mary of the Cross MacKillop.

# BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES – NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS AND CONTRACTORS

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering.

Then click on 'Contractor Form' (bottom of page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are contracting.
